Checklist for a Notice of Entry

While the laws on a landlord entering a property vary by location, a notice of entry will generally include the following information.	
	The tenant's name
	The reason for entry
	The rental property address
	The day and time of scheduled entry — landlord entry generally occurs during normal business hours
	The date and time the notice was delivered — most places require at least a 24-hour notice to enter, and requirements can range up to five days. This ensures the tenant has sufficient warning before the landlord enters the rental property
	The landlord's contact information
